

Making OA Work (excerpts reprinted from Lifeline Magazine)

Our local Committee for the Retention of Longtimers suggests that each OA member make the effort to retain longtimers in program. Are the following statements true of each of us?

- 1. I value every new phase of my recovery.
- 2. I understand the ramifications of leaving OA. I have a healthy fear of relapse.
- 3. I keep bringing my body to the truth so I'll be near it when I'm ready for it.
- 4. There is no easier, softer way for me. I am not on the slippery slope to a relapse.
- 5. I have sane abstinence rather than stark raving abstinence.
- 6. I accept longtimers at all levels of recovery.
- 7. I am appreciated for the service I do, and I focus on the traditions.
- 8. I have a sponsor, and my sponsor has a sponsor.
- 9. I work the Steps with rigorous honesty.
- 10. I believe in the Twelve Traditions.
- 11. Longtimers want what I have.
- 12. I reach out to longtimers.
- 13. I am committed to giving back what I have so generously been given.

Here are some suggestions for groups to help retain longtimers:

- 1. Celebrate your group's anniversary.
- 2. Highlight your group's successes, challenges or creative ideas in your intergroup or region newsletter.
- 3. Encourage all members to commit to attending and doing service for a home meeting.
- 4. Use coins, chips or cards to honor time in program.
- 5. Do countdowns of time in program.
- 6. Make a sponsorship pact with someone that if either of you stops going to meetings, the other has permission to drag you there.
- 7. Request a complimentary copy of your intergroup or region newsletter and send it to a longtimer with an attached note.

Seven good ideas:

- 1. Be inclusive, not exclusive.
- 2. Meet for coffee before or after a meeting.
- 3. Gently guide and teach newcomers.
- 4. Offer to drive someone to a meeting.
- 5. Don't tell me, show me.
- 6. Take advantage of opportunities to do Twelve Step work.
- 7. Pass a basket at meetings with the phone numbers of those present, and call the person whose number you draw.

Here are some suggestions to encourage member retention:

- 1. Name your meeting something special (for example, Hand-in-Hand or Saturday Survivors).
- 2. When the meeting opens, state the meeting time and length.
- 3. Encourage fellowship after the meeting (for example, over lunch or coffee).
- 4. Give others your telephone number, especially newcomers and returning relapsers.
- 5. Call others when you arrive home from that night's meeting, or call them the next day.
- 6. Offer to meet with newcomers and others before the next meeting.
- 7. Call others the night before.
- 8. Ask for hugs.
- 9. Wear name tags with or without phone numbers (have scraps of papers and pens easily available). Consider switching name tags at the end of the meeting so you can call that person during the week.
- 10. When you give your number to others, clearly state the best time for them to call.
- 11. Dine with fellow OA members.

CALLING ON MY HIGHER POWER

As a child I had many nicknames over the years that were not very flattering for a "chubby" kid. Now as a woman in recovery from compulsive eating for 38 years, maintaining a 50 pound weight loss for decades, I have many more flattering nicknames. My birthday is in October and my husband liked to buy me a pumpkin and write adoring names on my pumpkin. In my morning quiet time of prayer and meditation I wrote a short note to my Higher Power.
